Circe's long wand	Pg. 160 It is her power, it's like a long stick maybe	Without her wand she is vulnerable & powerless (shows power)	
Fast Black Ship	Pg. 158 There transportation	It represents there transportation across the sea & how powerful it is	
Potion of malignant drugs	Pg. 158 Circe's dangerous drugs	It represents her power also her intelligence in tricking people
